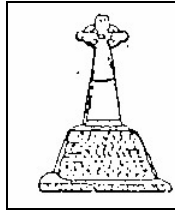

NEWS FROM BRYMBO COMMUNITY COUNCIL

REPORT FROM ALAN CARDIFF (CLERK TO THE COUNCIL) 31/10/2005

The following matters were discussed at the October meeting.

POLICING

Pc Steve Owen, Community Beat Officer, was not able to attend the meeting due to other duties but had given the Clerk, Alan Cardiff, a written crime report for the period since the September meeting. Certain of the reports of juvenile nuisance were the result of the build up to Halloween and Pc Owen had visited the three primary schools in the community to talk to the children. St Mary's School, Bwlchgwyn School, and Tanyfron School have all now been given quantities of the fluorescent bibs as part of the schools Road Safety Project, which Pc Owen has been involved with. A survey has been completed prior to the onset of the Neighbourhood Panels Scheme, that the Police are actively promoting. Bwlchgwyn will be the first village in the community to be involved, and residents have been involved in consultations and will serve on the Panels.

ROADS

The Clerk read out a letter from Wrexham County Borough Council which informed the Council that the Highways Supervisor had paid a visit to Glascoed Road following complaints about its condition, but he failed to find a problem, although it will continue to be monitored. A "No Entry" sign has now been replaced at the junction of College Hill/Tanyfron Road alleviating a potentially dangerous situation. Councillors expressed dissatisfaction at the quality of general repair work to roads in the community.

BUS SHELTERS

A bus shelter taken away for repair has now been returned to its position in Coed Y Felin Road.

LAMPS

The Clerk is to arrange a site meeting with the relevant participants to try and establish why a new lighting column on the Mount Hill does not have a mains supply to it.

PUBLIC FOOTPATHS

The Council is to respond to the Wrexham County Borough Council's Rights of Way Improvement Plan which will need to be done before 24 February 2006. The help of the Ramblers Association is to be sought, and any residents who regularly walk Rights of Way and wish to make comment are invited to make representations to Community Councillors, or directly to the Rights of Way Dept. of Wrexham County Borough Council.

WAR MEMORIALS

Representatives of the Community Council will lay wreaths at Memorials at Services to be held in Brymbo, Bwlchgwyn, and Tanyfron on Remembrance Sunday.

DONATIONS

The Community Council have granted donations to St Mary's Church Brymbo PCC for maintenance of the churchyard, and Brymbo W.I.

CITIZENS ADVICE BUREAU

The Community Council is funding the Outreach Service, which operates in Brymbo and Tanyfron, for another year at a cost of £2818.40. Posters showing the dates, time and location for the Service will be put up.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Amongst the Planning Applications considered were an application for a residential development on land to the rear of the Black Lion Inn Brymbo, the demolition of the Engedi Chapel building and erection of four houses in High Street, and the erection of stables and construction of new accesses at Glascoed Road Bwlchgwyn.

BRONWENS GREEN

An application has been to Dee Valley Water for the connection of a water supply to a football changing facility that will be erected at the site, and for which an application has been submitted for Building Regulations Approval.

FLY TIPPING

Letters of thanks are to be sent to Brymbo Developments Ltd and the Chief Environment Officer of Wrexham County Borough Council for their cooperation in having a significant amount of fly tipping removed from the beauty spot at Glascoed Wood. Brymbo Developments Ltd have put in barriers to deter any culprits in the future and the Community Council is very grateful for the work they have done. Residents who attended the September meeting to address the Council about the problem have thanked the Community Council for the role it has played in having the area restored to its original state. Councillors hope this

beauty spot can now continue to be enjoyed by visitors in the foreseeable future. **Anyone witnessing fly tipping should contact the Environment Agency on their hot line number 0800 80 70 60. Conviction of culprits can lead to a fine of up to £20,000 and/or imprisonment.**
